Introduction

Using HTTP Access to query data from MS SQL Server using SQLXML is no longer supported by Microsoft in SQLXML v4.0, and is no longer supported on Wonderware System Platform 2014.

System Platform 2012R2 is the last version to support using HTTP Access over MS SQLXML v3.0.

When HTTP Access is not supported, you will see the warning message **No results were returned. Please check your SQL statements.**

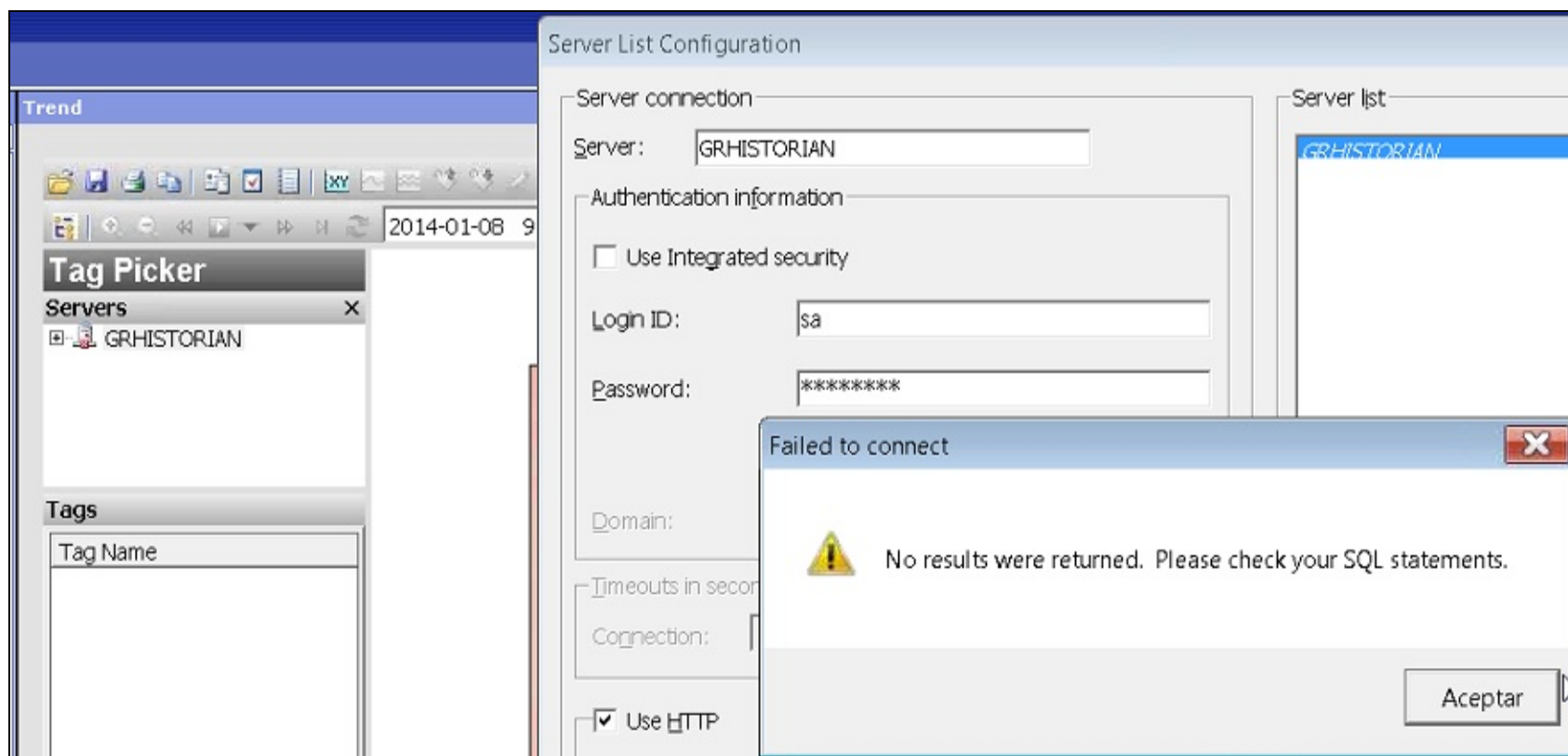


FIGURE 1: SQL FAILED TO CONNECT MESSAGE

This condition makes Historian Client 10.1 and WIS 5.0 Web Client (Trend, Query, Workbook & Report) unable to use this HTTP method to run a query on Historian.

- Historian Client: 10.1
- WIS 5.0: Web Client
- Windows 2008, Windows 7 and other Windows operating systems

Resolution

HTTP access on Client PC issue can be resolved by the following Hotfixes:

- If you are connecting using HTTP Mode and your Historian is installed on SQL 2008 or 2012:
 - Apply **HF L00125821** to Historian Client v10.1 on Server/Client PCs.
- If you are connecting using WIS AFweb Trend and your Historian installed on SQL 2008 or 2012;
 - Apply **HF L00125821** on WIS Sever/and each WIS Clients, or
 - Apply **HF L00130017** on Wonderware Information Server 5.0, then reinstall the Web Client(s) on each WIS client PC.
