Introduction

This *Tech Note* describes how to access the hard-drive and check the cable to the OIC display.

Application Versions

• Series A OIC Panel: Part Number OICB-15S-2EMXU and prior (C and D)

Procedure

The following graphic shows the locations of all screws you must remove in order to access the hard drive (Figures 1a-e below).

1. Remove the screws designated by the red highlights in the following figures.

Depending on the size of your device, the top mounting brackets may need to be removed (Figure 1E: Top View graphic).

2. Once you remove all the screws, slide the back plate up approximately one inch, then remove it (Figure 2 below).

3. Remove the two plate screws, slide the plate HDD out and flip it upside down (Figure 3 below).

4. Remove the four screws holding the HDD to the Mounting Plate (Figure 4 below).

5. Gently pull the ribbon cable with even pressure, being careful not to bend the pins (Figure 5 below).

Check the Transparent Cable Connection to the Display

• Verify the transparent cable is connected and not pinched (Figures 6-7 below).
