# Tech Note 914 Resetting the Log Record Number in the SMC Logger

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### Introduction

Customers and System Integrators alike will use a development system to configure, test and validate their entire Application setup prior to moving it to the production environment. During the development phase, a lot of testing and troubleshooting occurs. As a result, the System Management Console (SMC) logs get filled with different kinds of messages.

When the system is ready for delivery or commissioning, the previous testing phase and troubleshooting logs will be cleared. The problem is, after purging the SMC Log, the log record number does not revert back to zero. If the log record number ends with a number in the thousands or millions, even after purging the logs, the clean log will still start with that last number.

This *Tech Note* explains how to make the necessary changes to revert the SMC Log record number back to zero. Reverting to zero defines the point at which the system was implemented or installed. Further, it is good practice to revert to a 0 point during a maintenance task, for example each year.

### **Application Versions**

- ArchestrA System Management Console version 0027.0021 (shipped with System Platform 2012 or above)
- Tested with SMC that comes with InTouch 10.1 SP3 P01/Application Server 3.1 SP3 P01
- This tech note should work with versions as early as InTouch 10.0 / Application Server 3.0. However it has *not* been tested against those versions.

## **Prerequisites**

- ArchestrA System Management Console
- You should be familiar with using and doing the following:
  - SMC Logger
  - Stopping and starting services
  - Editing the Windows Registry

**Warning:** Serious problems might occur if you modify the registry incorrectly by using Registry Editor or by using another method. These problems might require that you reinstall the operating system. Microsoft or Invensys cannot guarantee that these problems can

be solved. Modify the registry at your own risk.

• Make sure that all the required logs are either exported or backed-up.

#### **Problem Description**




FIGURE 1: SMC LOGGER SHOWING THE INCREASING LOG RECORD NUMBER (LEFT COLUMN)

The SMC Log record number increases as more information gets written into the log (Figure 1 below).

When the logs are purged, the log record number in the cleaned log will start off where it left off previously.




FIGURE 2: SMC LOG RECORD NUMBER INCREMENTS BY ONE AFTER THE LOG IS PURGED

For example, before the SMC Log was purged, the last record was 52604. After purging the log, the record will start with 52605 (Figure 2 below).

### Resetting the SMC Log Record Number

To reset the SMC Log record number, complete the following steps:

1. Make sure that all the required logs are either exported or backed-up, then purge the SMC log.




FIGURE 3: EXPORTING THE SMC LOG




FIGURE 4: BACKING UP THE SMC LOG

2. In Services, stop the ArchestrA Logger Service.




FIGURE 5: STOPPING THE ARCHESTRA LOGGER SERVICE

- 3. Open the Registry Editor (regedit) and look for where the ArchestrA Logger state is saved.
  - For 64-bit OS: **HKLM\SOFTWARE\Wow6432Node\ArchestrA\Framework\Logger\State**
  - For 32-bit OS: HKLM\SOFTWARE\ArchestrA\Framework\Logger\State




FIGURE 6: REGISTRY KEY FOR THE SMC LOGGER STATE

4. Right-click on **State** and export this key. The export generates a **.REG** file. Give the file any name; for example **LoggerState.REG**.

5. Open the .REG file using Notepad.




FIGURE 8: EDITING THE EXPORTED REGISTRY FILE IN NOTEPAD





FIGURE 9: EXPORTED REGISTRY FILE EDITED IN NOTEPAD

6. Blank out the ActiveLogFile value and change ALL the other DWORD / QWORD values below that to 0 (Figure 9 below).

**DO NOT** modify the registry path above the **ActiveLogFile** line.

- 7. Save and close the edited file.
- 8. Merge the edited .REG file back into the registry by double-clicking on the .REG file.
- 9. Click **Yes** to continue.




FIGURE 11: INFORMATION MESSAGE (Success)

10. Click **OK** when the operating system notifies you that the new keys and values have been successfully merged (Figure 11 below).

11. Delete all the aaLOG / aaLDX files in the LogFiles folder.

Depending on the Operating System, they are located in either of the following folders:

- Newer OS: <ROOTDRIVE>:\ProgramData\ArchestrA\LogFiles
- Older OS: < ROOTDRIVE >:\Documents and Settings\All Users\Application Data\ArchestrA\LogFiles




FIGURE 12: ARCHESTRA SMC LOG FILES LOCATION

12. Start the **ArchestrA Logger Service**.




FIGURE 13: START THE ARCHESTRA LOGGER SERVICE

13. The next time you open the SMC Logger, the log record number starts with  ${\bf 0}$ .
